This is very much a hands-on winery with great care taken to ensure plantings of vines are between 3,800 to 4,800 vines per hectare which ensures lower yields of around five to eight tonnes per hectare of optimal quality grapes.

Patatsblanc arose when Reenen Borman, the winemaker at Boschkloof behind the celebrated Chenin Blanc from Patatsfontein in Montagu, decided that some of the Colombard on the property was too good to pass up and so devised a Colombard-Chenin Blanc blend intended to be accessible but not superficial. In this he has certainly succeeded as the wine has been highly scored by many top wine journalists.
